
## <u>Journey in Christ – Disciples at Donelson Shoney</u> <u>The Farewell Discourse</u>

John 14:25-31 I have been telling you these things while still with you; but the <u>Paraclete</u>, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things, and remind you of all I have spoken to you. Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace which the world cannot give; I will give to you. Do not allow your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away and shall return. If you loved me you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you this now, before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe. I shall not talk to you much longer, because the prince of this world is on his way. He has no hold on me; his coming will only serve to let the world see that I love the Father and that I acted as the Father ordered. Come now, let us be going.

- I. The final words in the Upper Room/Chamber
- II. For the second time the Master tells us "Do not allow your hearts to be agitated or afraid."
  - a. Fretting is the enemy of faith
  - b. Agitated = confused
  - c. Afraid = timid
- III. The issue of this evening is transition
  - a. Jesus returns to his pre-incarnation self
  - b. From the Father he sends the Paraclete
    - i. He is to be our guide
      - 1. Teaching
      - 2. Empowering the word
- IV. We are to be heirs of a new world order
  - a. PEACE our inheritance
  - b. <u>Paraclete</u> the only means of this grace
