1. Why the ancient lands of Dan?

Isaiah 8:23-24 For is not everything dark as night for a country in distress? As the past humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, so the future will glorify the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, the territory of the nations. Philip the Tetrarch, is Herod Philip II (Greek: Ἡρώδης Φίλιππος) ruled from 4 BC until his death in AD 34 - was the son of Herod the Great and his fifth wife, Cleopatra of Jerusalem. Born in @ 26 BC He was a half-brother of Herod Antipas and Herod Archelaus; and must not be confused with Herod II, also Herod Philip.
