The life that he lived, qualified him for the death that he died – Both the life and the death are from the person he is.

We have been, these three weeks, in John 7 - this is the fall festival time in Israel (The Festivals of the Torah). We began in Galilee, where Jesus is challenged by his brothers (John 7:1-13). Then we looked at his ministry under the constant threat of arrest and death (5:18; 7:1, 19, 45-52; 11:53). This week we return to the City of David and the Feast of Tabernacles.

Then He said again to them, "I go away, and you will seek Me, and will die in your sin; where I am going, you cannot come."
