Whoever cares for his own safety is lost; but if a man will let himself be lost for my sake, that man is safe. What will a man gain by winning the whole world, at the cost of his true self? (Luke 9:23-24 NEB)

Understanding The Mystery

If an archeologist were uncovering an ancient ruin and came across a marking on the structure, it would signal identity of the building. Should it be a cross, the structure would be marked as "Christian." The cross is the single universal emblem (symbol) of the Christian faith. Instead of being embarrassed by the execution of Jesus – his followers embrace his horrid death and have made it the cornerstone of their message and their badge of honor. 1 Corinthians 2:2. The cross is profoundly more than something that happened to Jesus.

- 1) Christ's cross measures all Biblical interpretation
- 2) The cross reveals sin
- 3) It establishes Christian values and measures life
- 4) It declares what is true Christian discipleship
- 5) The cross is personal

Everything that is authentically Christian must conform to the cross so as to be measured by Christ himself. True and real salvation and ministry must be centered in the Golgotha event and ethic. The Lord of the church calls us to the cross as the only universal standard to which we must more than conform – we must unite with him in the mystery of his death.

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death. Philippians 3:10.

- 2. How would living out the cross affect your daily life?
