- 4. The splendor of his life and the horror of his death are the basis of our understanding At-one-ment
- 5. When Jesus cries "My God!" or "MY Father!" he is not crying to the covenant God of Israel, but his personal God intimacy
- 6. In the face of Jesus we must understand sin, God and righteousness
