Corinthians 15:13-15 (NET) *If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is futile, and your faith is empty. Also, we are found to be false witnesses about God for we have testified against God that he raised Christ from the dead, when in reality he did not raise him, that is if indeed the dead are not raised.*

1. I am leaping ahead in Corinthians to face this holy week...
“God is dead. God remains dead. And we have killed him. How shall we comfort ourselves, the murderers of all murderers? What was holiest and mightiest of all that the world has yet owned has bled to death under our knives: who will wipe this blood off us? What water is there for us to clean ourselves? What festivals of atonement, what sacred games shall we have to invent? Is not the greatness of this deed too great for us? Must we ourselves not become gods simply to appear worthy of it?” – Fredrick Nietzsche

 - a. About politics – “We have no king except Caesar.”
 - b. About religion – That rejects Jesus as a blasphemer
